**Kane Cemetery**

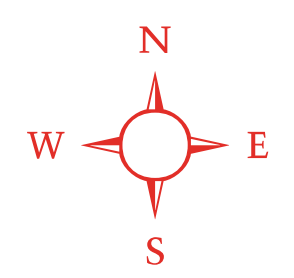
Kane Cemetery, located one mile north of the confluence of the Big Horn and Shoshone Rivers, and on the west side of the Big Horn River, served the communities of Kane and Iona.

141 individuals are buried in Kane Cemetery. The oldest birth date of those buried is 1822. The oldest gravesite is 1903 and the most recent is 2000. The birthplace of those buried ranges from various places in the United States and includes the following countries: Denmark, Switzerland; Russia; Alberta, Canada; England; and Austria. There are many infants buried in Kane, with 40% of those buried listed as being under the age of 20.

Kane Cemetery now resides within the boundaries of Bighorn Canyon NRA, surrounded by a barbed wire fence. Close to the bank of the Big Horn River, and in the shadow of the Big Horn Mountains, the small cemetery with cement and granite headstones or simple white landscaping rocks to discern a grave site, is a testament to those early pioneers of Kane and Iona.
